Focused on rectifying planning deficiencies related to Invasive Alien Species (IAS), the project aims to develop a data-driven workflow guiding decisions on IAS management in pilot river basins.

With a duration of six years and co-funding from the LIFE program of the European Union and the three Belgian regional authorities, Life RIPARIAS stands as a collaborative effort offering a strategic framework for crafting effective and coherent management strategies aimed at minimising the impact of biological invasions.
