
Invasive species native to Asia. Rare in the wild in Belgium

Found in wetlands and cool forest environments, in partially shaded sites



Terrestrial or submerged semiaquatic perennial plant. Grows to heights of 30 to 40 cm

There is a cultivar with tricolour leaves which has, however, not been observed in the wild vet



Fast growing rhizomatous species forming dense stands

Small yellow flowers crowded into a short spike
